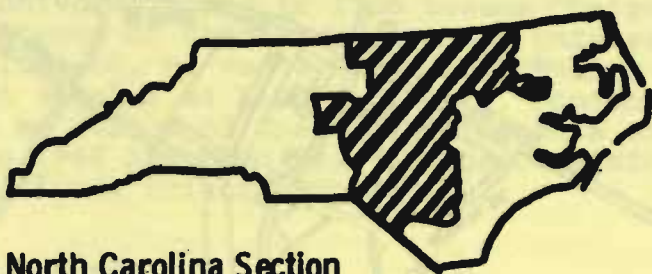

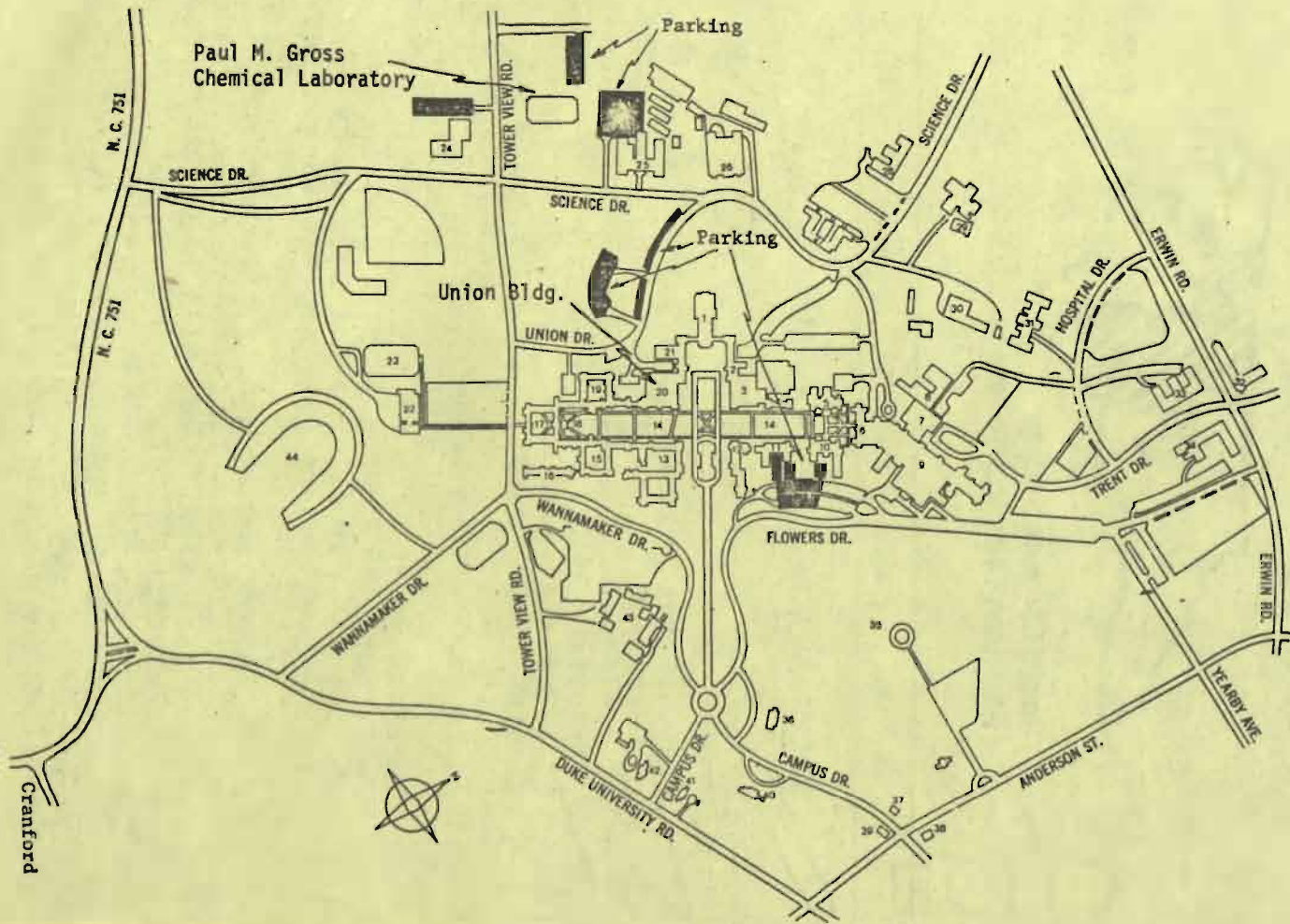

The lecture will begin at 8:30 p.m. in Room 103 of the Paul M. Gross Chemical Laboratory of Duke University. The enclosed map provides directions.

Dr. M. Kent Wilson, Head of the Chemistry Section, Research Grants Division, National Science Foundation, Washington, D. C. will speak on "Federal Support of Research."

Dr. Wilson received a B.S. degree from the University of Utah in 1943 and a Ph.D. from the California Institute of Technology in 1949. From 1948 to 1956, he was a member of the faculty at

Harvard University and in 1956 became Chairman of the Department of Chemistry at Tufts University. During 1954-55, he was a Guggenheim Fellow and Fulbright Scholar at King's College, London. He has been an editor of Spectrochimica Acta since 1963 and since 1966 has been Head of the Chemistry Section of the National Science Foundation.
