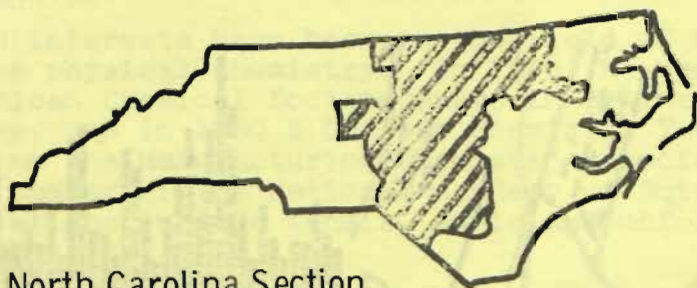

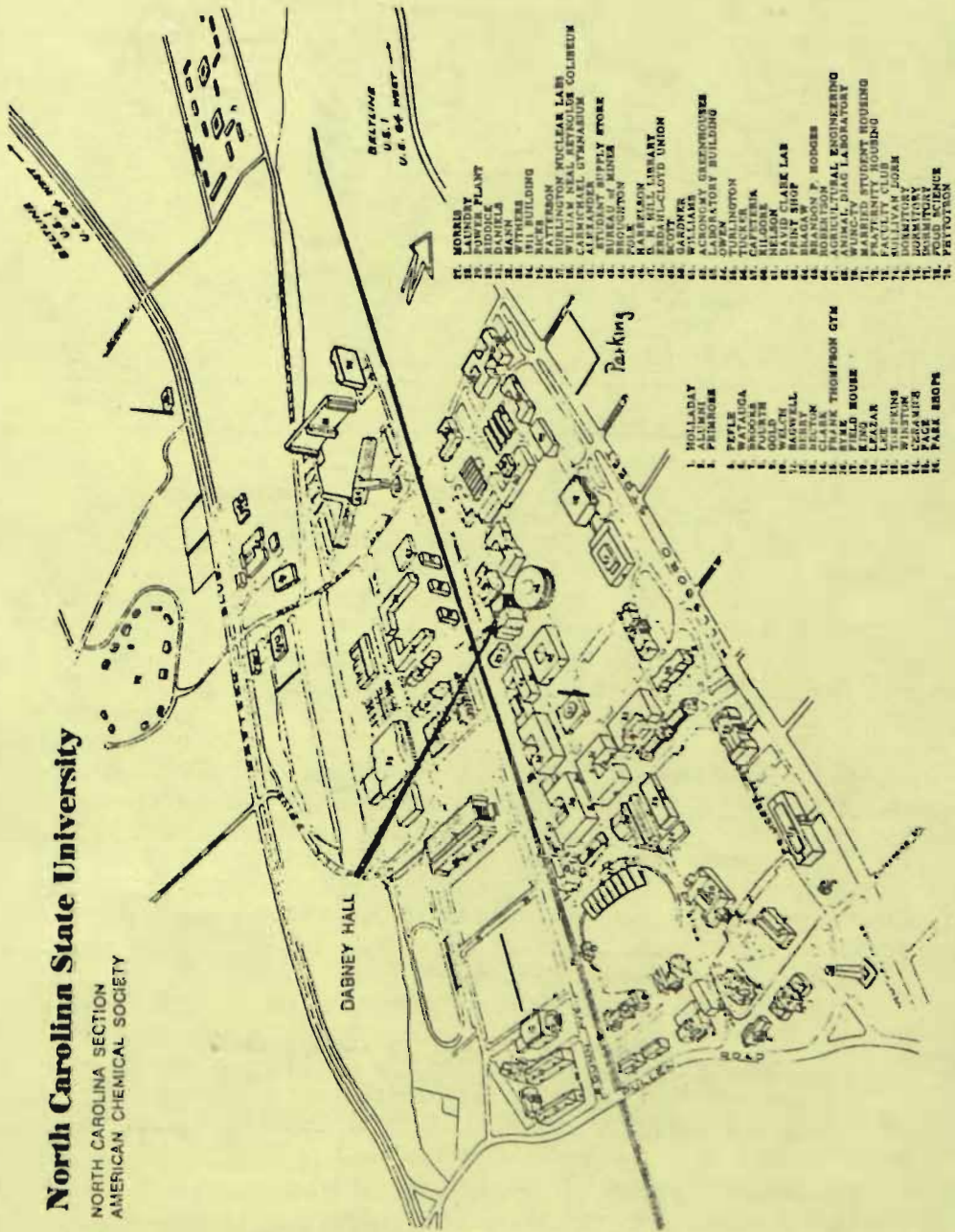
Our speaker is Dr. Walter H. Stockmayer of Dartmouth College. His topic will be "Contortions of Polymer Chains" and will deal with some recent work on both equilibrium and non equilibrium aspects of chain statistics and dynamics.

Walter H. Stockmayer received both his B.S. and Ph.D. degrees from M.I.T., and also holds a B.Sc. from Oxford, where he was a Rhodes scholar. After two years as an instructor at Columbia University, he returned to the M.I.T. Chemistry Department and stayed there until 1961, when he moved to his present position at Dartmouth College in New Hampshire. Professor Stockmayer's principal
